

How to choose the right paint

Water based paints (acrylics) are the most commonly used. Acrylic paints have a number of advantages over oil based paints. Drips and splashes can be removed with a wipe of a damp cloth and when the job is done, brushes and rollers can be cleaned in water.

Acrylic paints give off almost no fumes when applied and take less time to dry than oil based paints.

The higher the sheen level of a paint, the more harder wearing it is.

Matt: Matt finishes offer a flat, glare free finish which helps to hide minor imperfections. Easy to apply it's suitable for ceilings and walls in low traffic areas. Our Matt has a 2% sheen level

Durable: Durable finishes provide a very soft sheen. It's perfect for walls and ceilings in high traffic areas that need to be wiped clean regularly such as kitchens, bathrooms and hallways. Our durable has a 14% sheen level

Satin: Less shiny than gloss with a velvety lustre. With a high durability, it's ideal for woodwork and trim including furniture. Our Satin has a 25% sheen. For the best finish bare wood should be primed first.

Eggshell: Ideal for exterior facias & soffits, our eggshell has a 35% sheen. It can be used on top of oil based gloss and can be used for interiors such as kitchen cabinets. For the best finish any bare wood should be primed first.
